

Celebrating 10 Seasons of Exploring the Sunshine State

Florida Road Trip explores the history, culture, and people that make Florida unique. On our tour around the Sunshine State, we uncover little-known stories and reveal new sides to places big and small.

Celebrating its 10th Season, *Florida Road Trip* continues to take viewers on exciting journeys to explore the cities and towns they call home or love to visit. Originally titled *Central Florida Roadtrip*, the Emmy award-winning show expanded in 2022 to cover the entire state and now airs on all Florida public television stations.

In 2024, **Scott Fias** joined as the host and master story-teller of *Florida Road Trip*. With over a decade of experience traveling the state and sharing stories about Florida's people and communities, Scott brings fresh energy and insight to the series.

NewsNight is WUCF's weekly half hour program featuring journalists from radio, TV, newspapers, and blogs across Central Florida. Through roundtable discussions, the panel dives into important local issues, sharing the stories behind the headlines.

Each week, they break down the news and explain how it impacts the community, keeping viewers informed and engaged with the issues that matter most.

NewsNight over the past year, explored critical topics such as the environment, elections, hurricane resiliency, arts funding, and more.

Expanding its impact beyond the studio, NewsNight Conversations engaged the community directly, fostering meaningful civic dialogue on the region's most pressing issues. In May 2024, NewsNight hosted a two-part NewsNight Conversations series where community members and stakeholders examined the years-long effort to restore Florida's treasured Indian River Lagoon, discussing progress made and the challenges that remain in rejuvenating and preserving this vital waterway and its wildlife.

On My Way To K



Expanding Our Reach in 2024

In 2024, WUCF's On My Way To K initiative reached more than **4,165 children and caregivers** across Central Florida with interactive, co-learning resources and experiences. The program extended its reach through an interstitial series about school tools viewed by **more than 10,000 households** monthly on WUCF.

A Story of Real Impact

At a Winter Park event, a caregiver shared a powerful story: her son, who had struggled with pencil grip, finally learned to hold a pencil correctly after receiving personalized guidance from a WUCF facilitator. She expressed, "This will make an incredible impact on [my son's] educational journey."

Inclusivity at the Core

Inclusivity is at the heart of **On My Way To K**. Through community events, multi-media content, and educational resources like our guidebook and Sensory Spaces, WUCF helps families feel confident and prepared for the first day of kindergarten and beyond.

Ready To Learn

Expanding Educational Impact

From February to June 2024, WUCF's **Ready To Learn** project delivered five enriching educational experiences to more than 400 children, caregivers, and educators in our Osceola County Learning Neighborhood. These PBS KIDS-themed workshops build skills in everyday literacy, computational thinking, and the world of work.

Fostering Intergenerational Learning

Ready To Learn fosters intergenerational co-learning. One family, spanning four generations, participated in a Ready To Learn session and took home a Family Game Night kit. They later shared how playing educational games together strengthened their connection and learning experience.

Building Social and Academic Skills

Caregivers noted how inspiring it was to see their children collaborating with others to solve problems, building both social and academic skills. Many expressed feeling motivated to create similar learning experiences at home.

Strengthening Community Partnerships

Through these inclusive events and strong community partnerships, WUCF's **Ready To Learn** project continues to empower families, making educational success a shared journey.

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
